Today we celebrate Founders' Day at Knollwood Baptist Church. The opening hymn "O God of Love" was written by our beloved founding pastor, Dr. Jack Ricks Noffsinger, in 1983 to commemorate Knollwood's twenty-fifth anniversary. The final hymn "In This Place of Light and Beauty" was commissioned for the rededication of Knollwood's sanctuary September 16, 2012. The hymnist, Mel Bringle, writes, "The primary image of the hymn focuses on the strikingly beautiful clear glass windows of the renovated sanctuary. In fact, the metaphor of 'window' serves as a unifying feature for the four stanzas of the hymn, each of whose closing lines identifies something through which we perceive the glory of God. In addition to this unifying device, the hymn takes its structure from the basic pattern of worship: gathering, word, sacrament, and sending." Copies of Dr. Bringle's essay about this hymn are available in the narthex.

ABOUT OUR BANNERS

"The way" is a familiar biblical theme encompassing such truths as "the way of the Lord" (Isaiah 40:3), Jesus as "the way" (John 14:6), and "the way" as a description of Christian discipleship (Acts 9:2). The words on the banner point to the movements of faith: *Longing* for God that impels us forward in the spiritual journey; *Learning* the way of the Scriptures and the way of Jesus; *Loving* as our love for God and our neighbors deepens; and *Living* as we live out of Christian faith and witness in the world.

The colors of the banner emphasize green for "ordinary time," the period in the church year between Pentecost and Advent. The artist who designed and painted the banners is our own Bambi Setzer.
