

WCC CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The large pile of dirt on the Wellness and Community Center construction site will be used to backfill after the walls of the building are in place. Rebar for footings was delivered last week, and structural steel is expected to be delivered in the next four to six weeks. Material demands of the construction industry are high at the moment, and the timing of steel delivery adds about a month to the schedule.

A concerted effort has been made to save three trees on the back side of the work site. However, concern about the health of these trees--and the safety of construction workers--led to a professional evaluation. David Lusk, MA, a well-respected arborist, conducted an evaluation and recommended that all trees in the buffer area be removed and replaced.

Fortunately, Knollwood's contract with IL Long includes a landscape plan developed by MLA Design Group and approved by the Planning Board. This plan includes putting back appropriate plantings and trees in the affected area.
