## **INTRODUCING JOSH GODWIN**

The Search Committee is delighted to introduce Joshua K. Godwin for your consideration as our Minister of Youth and Recreation.

Josh grew up in Wade, NC, in the eastern part of the state. He began his education at UNC-Chapel Hill and then transferred to Wingate when he was called to religious studies. After completing his undergraduate studies, he attended Wake Forest University School of Divinity and graduated this month. Josh's wife Alyssa is a NC native and elementary school teacher who shares his passion for ministry and young people.

While Josh is a new graduate, he is certainly not new to Youth Ministry. Since the summer of 2010, he has been working in various ministry capacities. He worked in Student Ministries and Vocational Ministries at Wingate, and he also coordinated and led summer service opportunities through Carolina Cross Connections. He served as Intern Youth Director at a Methodist church and has served more than two years as Family Ministries Pastor at a Friends church while in Divinity School.

Josh was referred to Knollwood by his professor, Bill Leonard, and friend/classmate Daniel Potter. He rose to the top of the candidate pool early in our search process, based on the strength of his resume and references. He really caught our attention in the video he created in response to a set of pre-interview questions. Finally, he wowed us all in his interview with a unique blend of lightness and humor, deep thinking and insight.

From the beginning of our search process, our committee prayed for clarity and consensus, and we were not disappointed on either front. We have come to this recommendation in complete agreement, with no doubts about Josh's capabilities or his "fit" with Knollwood. We hope you will agree with our assessment and join us in welcoming Josh with open arms.

## **ABOUT OUR BANNERS**

In the Bible and in church tradition, the dove and fire symbolize the Holy Spirit. According to the four Gospels, the Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove at his baptism (Mark 1:10 and parallels). John the Baptist promised the Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit "and with fire" (Matthew 3:11; Luke 3:16). From Moses' encounter with God by the burning bush (Exodus 3:1-6) to the tongues of fire at Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4), fire is a sign of God's riveting, transforming presence. The Pentecost banner depicts the fire of God's challenge and the dove of God's gentle loving care. The artist who designed and painted the Pentecost banner is our own Bambi Setzer.
