



## **ABOUT OUR BANNERS**

In the Bible and in church tradition, the dove and fire symbolize the Holy Spirit. According to the four Gospels, the Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove at his baptism (Mark 1:10 and parallels). John the Baptist promised the Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit "and with fire" (Matthew 3:11; Luke 3:16). From Moses' encounter with God by the burning bush (Exodus 3:1-6) to the tongues of fire at Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4), fire is a sign of God's riveting, transforming presence. The Pentecost banner depicts the fire of God's challenge and the dove of God's gentle loving care. The artist who designed and painted the Pentecost banner is our own Bambi Setzer.

## **NICKELS FOR NAILS**

This morning we receive the coins Knollwood has gathered for Nickels for Nails campaign for our upcoming interfaith, interracial Habitat Unity Build. Knollwood is playing a key role in Habitat for Humanity's Unity Build for 2016, joining with people of different races and faith traditions to build a Habitat house, and by doing so build stronger and lasting relationships.

The house build, which will start in late summer/early fall, is the sixth Unity Build for Forsyth County's Habitat and has long been supported by the Presbyterian Interracial Dialogue, Temple Emanuel and local mosques. The original Unity Build, in 2000, was the first such interfaith Habitat build in the country.

This year, Knollwood and United Metropolitan Missionary Baptist Church are joining with those groups and others in the city to promote a strong gathering of individuals who want to expand interracial and interfaith collaborations. Sylvia and Terry Oberle are serving as coordinators for Knollwood's Unity Build Team, which will help oversee Knollwood's engagement in this intergenerational effort. Initial team members are Bob Setzer, Clyde Cash, Melonie Almongual, Ed Southern, Penn and Natalie Broyhill, Jeff Stallings, JoAnne Goetz, Daniel Stinehelfer and Rich Habegger. Dr. Tim Pennell is serving as an honorary co-chair for the 2016 Unity Build.
