

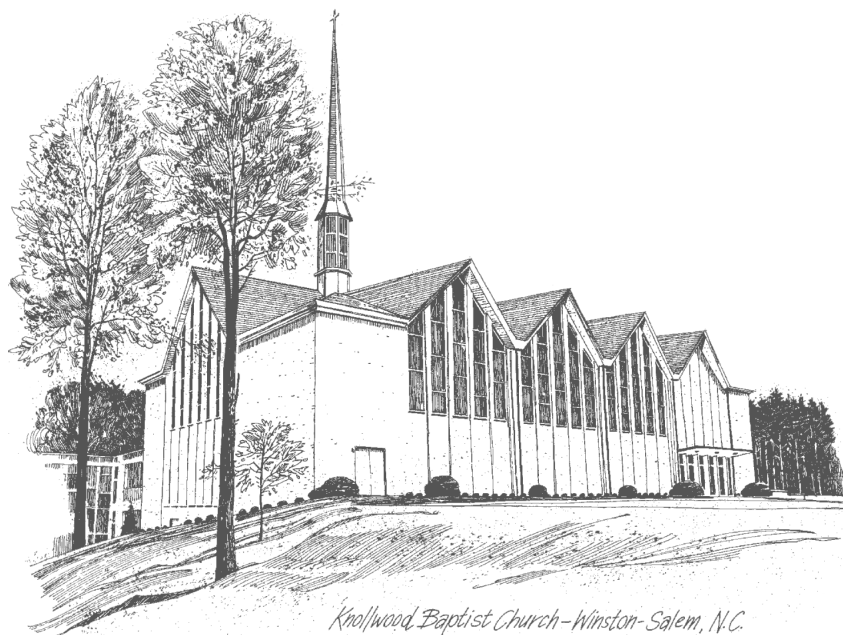

We express appreciation to guest musicians Christopher Williams, Lousson Smith, Jan Strohl, and Steve Shelton this morning. In today's service we use the term "Gradual" for the music following the reading of the Epistle Lesson (and the children's time). Going back to the early church and continuing in liturgical churches today, the reading of scripture is usually followed by singing—a Psalm, or a hymn. The music that is sung after the Epistle is called the Gradual, a term going back hundreds of years. Today's Call to Worship and Prayer of Confession were written by Knollwood member Dean Clifford. The acolytes are Shepherd Causby and Mason Maguire and the crucifer is Matthew Maguire.

ABOUT OUR BANNERS

The Easter banner views Jesus' resurrection from the inside of the tomb looking out. The grave clothes reflect the note in John 20:7 that the burial linens were left in the tomb with the head wrapping separate from the rest. The contrasting darkness within the tomb and the brightness outside point to the light of God's new day breaking upon a "new creation" (2 Corinthians 5:17). As Jesus exits the tomb,

clothed in a loin cloth, he is about to surprise Mary with the realization, "The Lord is risen! The Lord is risen indeed!" (John 20:18). The artist who painted the banner is our own Bambi Setzer.
