## Sharing the Bread and the Cup

*This morning, we will serve one another Communion as brothers and sisters in the family of God. Please use the center aisles to approach the tables at the front. Once a circle of worshipers forms around the table, the minister will offer the first person the bread of Communion and say, "The love of God for you." That person then passes the bread to the next person in the circle and says, "The love of God for you," and so on. As the bread is being passed, the minister will offer the chalice to the first person served and say, "The peace of Christ for you." That person will dip his or her bread in the chalice and take Communion. He or she will then hold the chalice for the next person in the circle and say, "The peace of Christ for you," and so on. Gluten-free wafers are available for those who need them.*

*(If you prefer to have Communion served at your seat, please indicate with a raised hand and a deacon will assist you.)*

## ABOUT OUR WORSHIP

Today is Trinity Sunday, the First Sunday after Pentecost, when we celebrate the doctrine of the Trinity. On this day, we sing two special hymns whose writers are worshipping with us.

First is a brand-new Trinitarian hymn, "Grace Unbounded," which was commissioned from the American hymnist Mary Louise "Mel" Bringle to accompany introduction of Knollwood's new logo and tagline. Dr. Bringle, who is professor of philosophy and religious studies at Brevard College, Brevard, NC, has hymns in many current hymnals. She also is editor of the latest edition of the Presbyterian hymnal, *Glory to God*.

The text and tune to our third hymn, “As He Gathered at His Table,” were written by hymnologist and hymn writer Dr. Paul Richardson, who recently retired from the church music faculty of Samford University, Birmingham, AL. The hymn tune, STUART, is named after his hometown of Stuart, VA.

We welcome guest organist Henry Tysinger. Mr. Tysinger retired in 2012 after 25 years as director of music and organist at Highland Presbyterian Church, Winston-Salem. He is currently serving as communications administrator of the Piedmont NC chapter of the American Guild of Organists and as substitute organist in the area.

Appreciation is expressed to Dan Knight for sharing his musical gifts this morning.

## **KNOLLWOOD’S NEW LOOK IS HERE**

Inspired by the recent renovations and new construction on KBC’s campus, we are introducing today a new logo and visual identity for the church. You can see all its features in the new brochure developed for our visitors, “Finding Grace Together,” in the pew racks.

Our logo comprises three components.

The first is a beautiful bird that represents grace as well as the traditional messages of the Holy Spirit and peace. In addition, the three elements of the bird signify the Trinity, and their overlapping shapes signify that Knollwoodians are diverse in thought and unified in Christ. The bird’s colors remind us of our familiar descriptive metaphor—“the wooded knoll.” Shades of green symbolize both the church and the good earth.

The second component is our wordmark—Knollwood Baptist Church—presented in a graceful, clear, and easy-to-read typeface. Its color is a traditional one for Knollwood: a vibrant teal.

The third component—*Grace Unbounded*—is an expression summarizing both the limitless grace freely given to us by God, and our calling to share grace abundantly with each other.

Another design element that will appear from time to time in Knollwood publications, complementing the logo, is a leafy branch such as one might observe outside our sanctuary windows.

Visual identity team members who have worked on this project for the past 10 months are Sandra Boyette, chair; Dorothy Wagener, vice chair; Forrest Causby; Gayle Anderson; Kathy Robinson; and Lindsay Sutton. Bob Setzer, Marlin Yoder, and Colleen Booth are working closely with the team.

## **ABOUT OUR BANNERS**

In the Bible and in church tradition, the dove and fire symbolize the Holy Spirit. According to the four Gospels, the Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove at his baptism (Mark 1:10 and parallels). John the Baptist promised the Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit “and with fire” (Matthew 3:11; Luke 3:16). From Moses’ encounter with God by the burning bush (Exodus 3:1-6) to the tongues of fire at Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4), fire is a sign of God’s riveting, transforming presence. The Pentecost banner depicts the fire of God’s challenge and the dove of God’s gentle loving care. The artist who designed and painted the Pentecost banner is our own Bambi Setzer.

## **FOR THE CHILDREN**

Worship Care is provided for children, infant - kindergarten aged on the first floor of Building B. Children’s Worship for 1st through 3rd graders meets on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Sundays of the month. During the Hymn of Devotion, children meet their leaders in the narthex to walk together to Children’s Worship (B244). After the worship service, parents pick up their children from B244. For the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays children are invited to enjoy the worship service with their families. ### **June 18– Love the Sinner**

June 12 marks the painful anniversary of the shooting at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida and provides an opening for us to reflect on how churches respond to hostility toward gay and lesbian persons. "Love the Sinner" is a documentary personal essay by Jessica Devaney, a progressive filmmaker and activist who grew up immersed in evangelical Christianity in Florida, then left that context (Jessica also did an MA in Religion at Wake Forest). In the wake of the mass shooting at Pulse, Jessica found herself wondering whether by avoiding hard conversations with church leaders, she had missed opportunities to face bias and contribute to change. Her short film (just 15 minutes) recently selected for the Tribeca Film Festival 2017, provides a provocative starting place for conversations about the limits of "tolerance" and the connection between difficult conversations and a wider welcome. Diane Lipsett will moderate a panel to begin discussion after the film. The film will start promptly at 10, so please gather before then. In the Chapel, Bldg. A.

### **July 2 – The Sacred Music of Duke Ellington**

Dan Knight, jazz pianist and scholar, will teach about and present the sacred, spiritual music of Duke Ellington (1899-1974), the iconic American composer, pianist, and bandleader of jazz orchestras. Music reviewer Richard Ginell comments, "Though Duke Ellington called his first concert of sacred music 'the most important thing I've ever done,' it might have been more accurately called the most controversial thing he had ever done..."
