ABOUT OUR BANNERS

"The way" is a familiar biblical theme encompassing such truths as "the way of the Lord" (Isaiah 40:3), Jesus as "the way" (John 14:6), and "the way" as a description of Christian discipleship (Acts 9:2). The words on the banner point to the movements of faith: Longing for God that impels us forward in the spiritual journey; Learning the way of the Scriptures and the way of Jesus; Loving as our love for God and our neighbors deepens; and Living as we live out of Christian faith and witness in the world.

The colors of the banner emphasize green for "ordinary time," the period in the church year between Pentecost and Advent. The artist who designed and painted the banners is our own Bambi Setzer.

THE LENTEN JOURNEY WITH JESUS

Lent is a 40-day season of spiritual reflection, prayer, and service that anticipates the church's celebration of Easter. This year, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14.

Feb. 14, Ash Wednesday Service and Lunch

Noon – Our Lenten journey will begin with a noon mid-day Ash Wednesday Service in the Chapel.

Worshippers who wish to participate will receive the imposition of ashes upon the forehead. A soup and bread luncheon will follow in the dining room.

Lent and the Art of Mending Brokenness – The Japanese practice of kintsugi is the art of mending broken ceramics using a resin filled with gold, silver, or platinum dust. Broken bowls, cups, plates, or vases are not discarded, nor are their breaks disguised, but become more beautiful in their shining repair. The centuries-old art (sometimes also called kinsukuroi) poetically conveys a commitment that resonates with our faith. Lent may remind us that breakage and repair are part of the history and the significance of persons and communities. Our breaks, scars and wounds need mending – but not disguising. Mended yet visible, they may offer beauty.

Ash Wednesday Evening

6:15 p.m. – An intergenerational beginning to Lent, with all ages together learning about this sacred season, moving through multi-sensory prayer stations, and sharing the imposition of ashes among families and friends.

Wednesdays in Lent – We'll explore "The Art of Mending Brokenness" as we move toward Good Friday and Easter – and those stories that say Jesus' scars remained visible even in resurrection.

We'll learn from Sylvia Oberle (Feb. 21) how a particular part of our city is moving toward mending.

We'll hear from Rodney Stilwell (Mar. 14) how neighbors in jails and prisons are finding their way toward hope and opportunity.

Rich small group options will include an exploration led by John Roach on the writings of Richard Rohr.

In these and other ways, we'll listen to one another as we reflect on how breakage and repair are a vital part of our own stories.
